# White Rose Mary E. Armstrong

Past State President

ary E. Armstrong was born on August 13, 1924 in Baltimore, Maryland. She graduated from Sidwell Friends, a Quaker high school. She attended Oberlin College in Oberlin, Ohio majoring in kindergarten-primary education and minoring in administration, and graduated in 1947 with a B.A. degree. Mary received her Master of Arts degree in 1954 from George Washington University in Washington, D.C. and then earned an additional thirty-five post graduate hours.

In 1952 Mary was invited to join Delta Chapter by her principal. She considered it such an honor and much joy. With Delta Chapter she served in many capacities such as chairman of committees as well as president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. She served as Delta Chapter's president from 1956 - 1958 and 1978 - 1980, and was the first Delta Chapter president to wear four Society pins at one time - Society pin, chapter president's pin, state president's pin, and a state founder's pin. The state founder's pin was returned to Delta Chapter at the death of Dr. Adele Stamp, a state founder and member of Delta Chapter.



In 2011, Mary Armstrong was honored for her 59 years of membership.

In Alpha Beta State there were the honors of serving as president (1967 – 1969), second vice president, and chairman of many committees. She loved being a member of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International

and very much enjoyed attending the International Conventions and Northeast Regional Conferences through the years.

Following her retirement from Montgomery County Public Schools after 33 years of teaching, she taught kindergarten full and part time at the Primary Day School on Bethesda, Maryland. While teaching part time, Mary became one of Maryland's few tree farmers on land inherited from her parents. She helped to collect the scientific writings and research findings of her father and presented them to the National Academy of Sciences.

Hobbies? Mary considered herself a Jack of all trades. She joined the Handyman Club of America and enjoyed church activities, gardening, reading, working at the polls, traveling, classical music, and enough about automotive mechanics to keep her station wagon going and going.

Mary's mottos were "Think young," "Keep learning from the cradle to the grave," and "Thank God" for the many privileges he helped her to have.

Mary Armstrong passed away on December 8, 2015 at Dogwood Village in Orange, Virginia.

#### **Chapter Standing Rules Updated**

The Bylaws Committee would like to thank all those chapters who have put so much time and effort into updating their Chapter Standing Rules. Some of the things we have learned along the way about "Chapter Standing Rules" come under the category, "Did you know?"

- Each chapter shall have chapter rules that are consistent with the Constitution and Bylaws and the Standing Rules of Alpha Beta State (Constitution: Article V.B.)
- According to the DKG Constitution, Chapters have the authority to make decisions related to:
  - Administration of membership, member files; financial obligations to chapter; recognition of membership achievements; nurturing
  - Assessments and management of chapter funds
  - Optional officers (second vice president; corresponding secretary)
  - Makeup of the executive board
  - Choice of standing committees
  - Number of meetings per year beyond the required 4
  - Quorum for meetings
  - Revising its chapter rules
- Chapter rules are to be in writing and checked periodically by the State Bylaws Committee to assure they are consistent with the state and international rules.


Each member should have a copy of her chapter's standing rules.
