

At the November 2014 program, Alpha Beta State Members experienced the technology train with presenter LaTanya K. Eggleston, RHO.





Most Alpha Beta State members said they use technology for personal and/or professional reasons; however, very few members were aware of the many technology resources available to them as DKG members. Here is what some members communicated about their expectations from this technology workshop: "to get ideas for professional and personal use"; "to locate websites that I could apply"; "to learn...and I did".

This workshop was designed to inform members about membership benefits with online webinars, with social media, with the United Nations, and with chapter website development.

Members were invited to build personal and professional skills with free on-demand (24/7) Webinars offered at http://www.capella.edu/alliance-webinars. This DKG partnership offers the opportunity to enhance or build skills like time management, leadership skills and more. Access to these webinars is also found on the International Website's homepage under announcements.

Members were invited to participate with the DKG Social Media Buzz using Facebook and Twitter. In fact, members created a twitter account at this workshop and were able to immediately begin following members state (https://twitter.com/coffeeltea) and international members (https://twitter.com/Blanton29). Connecting to members on social media also provides you with instant engagement during programs and conferences. We even have a You Tube Channel, which is a good addition to introduce potential members: https://www.youtube.com/user/DKGAustin

As you learned in last year's newsletter, there is a DKG and United Nations connection. One goal of our Educational Excellence Committee is to "To increase global awareness", and our UN connection does just that. So, members learned how to view the United Nations Briefings and other webcast. November Society Workshop Saturday, Nov. 1, 2014

Approximately, 52 Alpha Beta State sisters met at Ashton United Methodist Church for our Society Workshop sponsored by the Educational Excellence Committee. As the committee planned for the workshop, they focused on the goals of Early Career Educators, technology and the Alpha Beta State Organization. Our theme: Rebuilding our Direction through Dialogue, Technology and Early Career Educators was met through our activities for the day. After Dr. Janet Cornick had the DKG sisters recite the Seven Purposes of the Society, we began with a roundtable discussion. Our panelists represented a variety of ABS sisters in terms of membership years and their state, international or chapter involvement The panelists were Jean Gray (Omega), Sally Nazelrod (Xi), Cheryl Townshend (Omega), Joyce Conway (Delta), Patty Simon (Mu) and Bonnie Brose (Theta). Each panelist received questions prior to the event to prepare themselves. The questions were:

> (1) How has DKG benefited you? (2) What do you expect from DKG? (3) Why or why not do you attend State and International Events? (4) What prompted you to serve as an officer at the Chapter, State or International level in DKG? (5) How can we grow the ABS organization?

As the questions were answered by the panel, the audience members also had an opportunity to give their perspective. The discussions were lively and frank. If there was an important issue that needed to be addressed further, we placed it in the "Parking Lot". Many thanks goes to **Christine Langrehr** (Alpha Theta) who notated the information on the Parking Lot.

It would be impossible to list all the comments made during the discussion, but I will highlight the impressive points.

- Someone noticed me when asked to come a member of DKG
- Felt a sense of worth as a member of DKG
- As a member of DKG, it opened up a world of contact and expanded the possibilities of meeting new educators
- You are very supported in DKG (it is a ship in the ocean and the members are the harbor)
- DKG is a fellowship of life-long learners
- Ask for help when serving as an officer
- > You get out of something what you put into it
- As an officer, you learn more about DKG
- Find a partner to travel with you to the Conventions (State & International)
- Each chapter should investigate ways to financially support members who want to go to International events
- You see the "Best of the Best" at the Conventions
- You establish friends and fellowship at conventions
- We must market our events- articulate about the Society
- Key Women Educators- How can we define ourselves?
- Show excitement as a DKG member look at your body language and passion
- Look at all levels of education in our state and local functions

It is the hope of the EEC that this is the first of many discussions that we will have as a State Organization to just talk with the purpose of making meaningful changes to the way we function as ABS. Comments from the evaluations indicated that members will use the discussion format at the chapter level and focus on the issues presented. The members of the EEC committee are : Sally Nazelrod (Xi), Celeste Williams (Theta), Sharon Hilty (Delta), Dr. Terri Massie-Burrell (Alpha), Dr. Janet Cornick (Lambda), Raye Long (Rho) and Chair Joan Wiggins (Alpha Theta)

How are you involved in DKG?

Our opening activity was led by Celeste Williams (Theta) by having each member think about her current or past involvement in DKG. Previously at her chapter, members filled in the petals of a rose that listed various statements about DKG. We wanted to duplicate that idea for the State so we designed a rose activity and changed the various statements to include " served as a chapter officer, knows the words to the DKG song, who is the current International President or donated an item to Women in the Arts". As you answered the statements, you colored the petals on the rose. If there were blank petals, then you may have needed to rethink your level of involvement in the organization. Each member indicated that this activity was a clear indication about what we need to do at the local and state level. A copy of the rose activity is located on the state website- www.dkgmd.org.

Early Career Educators Workshop

It was our intention to have a dialogue with several early career educators in the Montgomery County area, but we were not able to secure these teachers. So we needed to come up with Plan B. Thanks to **Sharon Hilty** and **Sally Nazelrod**, we developed a workshop that included discussions among ourselves and making survival bags for new teachers. **Sally Nazelrod** prepared two articles " Great Expectations- Good news for Beginning Teachers and Inside the Mystery of Good Teaching" As we read various paragraphs, we reflected on our early years of teaching and what advice we could offer to new teachers. The second half of the workshop, we had a plethora of items to place in bags. Sharon prepared the items similar to a Thanksgiving Feast. Some of the items were:

A marble: for when you lose yours

A rubber band: to stretch yourself beyond the limits An eraser: to remind you everyone makes mistakes A tea bag: to remind you to take time to relax daily

The participants took the bags that they made to schools in their areas to give to the early career educators. In addition, the participants received a SEE chapter Report form and an individual volunteer form to complete.
