### State Honorary Membership Recognizing our "Sisters in Commitment"

Have you or your chapter considered nominating a woman for State Honorary Membership? State honorary membership is designed to recognize women who have made statewide contributions to education and the status of women, but who are not members of the education profession. Many are legislators, writers, judges, leaders of community organizations and others who have promoted excellence in education and empowered women. What a great way to recognize great women who share our purposes and goals!

This could be an interesting and informative project within your chapter. The process for submitting a recommendation is relatively easy:

- Complete a Recommendation for Membership (Form 11) with "state honorary" used as the type of membership. Be sure to include the necessary description of the woman's accomplishments and contributions. (These forms can be found at dkg.org.)
- Send the recommendation to the State Membership Committee -- addresses below -- by January 15, 2014. The committee will review it and present it to the Executive Board during the March 1, 2014 meeting. Voting on the recommendation will take place at the September 20, 2014 Executive Board meeting.
- 3. Initiation of state honorary member(s) will take place during the luncheon at the Alpha Beta State Organization Convention in 2015.
- It would be helpful if you could send a "heads up" to the committee prior to the deadline if you intend to recommend a woman for honorary membership. This may prevent duplication of efforts.

Think about it! Be mindful of the "happenings" in your local and state communities. What projects, events and accomplishments are benefiting women and education? Who is making a difference? Let's work together to recognize and support their efforts!

What a great week!



#### **WORLD FELLOWSHIP**

The World Fellowship Program came alive for me when, as a member of the International World Fellowship Committee, I was sent 75 applications from Fulbright scholars asking to be considered for our World Fellowship Program. These scholarships are for \$4000 and can be renewed after one year for \$800. The funding for these scholarships comes solely from you, our members. There is not a line item in the International budget for World Fellowships. We have tried to develop some clever methods to increase the donations for this worthwhile program.

The stories from the applicants touched the hearts of the committee members including one from a woman who was raised in a refugee camp in Iraq. She spoke of the hardships she endured as a refugee and particularly as a woman in this situation. She was encouraged by her family and got as much formal education as was possible. After returning to Afghanistan she attended university and graduated with top grades. She wishes to attend an American university and return to her country to develop programs for female students. Another student from Panama took a job as an aupair in the United States in order to become an effective speaker of English. She wishes to return to Panama to teach English as a Second Language at the university level.

### Focus on the U.S. Forum 2013 Northeast Regional Conference Report

Since 1988 the U.S. Forum's purpose has remained the same: to inform members on pending legislation that furthers the purposes of our Society; to be an advocate for women, children and education by maintaining affiliations with other similar organizations. During the recent Northeast Regional Conference interested DKG members of our region crowded into a "standing room only" session of the Forum on Thursday, July 25, 2013.

Dr. Elizabeth Tarner, 1996-1998 Chair of the U.S. Forum Steering Committee, warmly welcomed everyone to the session, introduced the program committee members and reviewed the agenda. She then explained the election proceedings for the 2013-2014 Northeast Regional Representative. The procedures were followed and after the two candidates were nominated from the floor the nominations were closed and their speeches were made. While the ballots were being counted we listened to our guest speaker, Mrs. Susan Scanlan, Virginia. She is the President of the Women's Research and Education Institute, Chair of the National Council of Women's Organizations, Honorary Member, Pennsylvania State Organization, Delta Kappa Gamma. During her address she emphasized that as women we are still "Fighting for a Place at the Table". She firmly believes in the Washington DC arena you are either at the feast or on the menu, therefore, we must diligently pursue our collective rights and issues. She shared with us legislation which she needed us to support by writing our Congressmen and Senators for the National Women's Museum (NMW).

It has been promised by Congress but never fully approved or funded. The NMW bills are (HR863/S398). She implored us to be diligent in seeking our women's rights, education funding and children's rights.

The results of the election were given after the guest speaker had completed her speech. **Carmela De Marco** was elected our new 2013-2014 NE Regional Representative.

**Beverly Johns, Virginia** led our discussion on state focus issues. Collectively, overall they were pension robbery, teacher evaluation and education budget cuts.

#### Election process to be considered at 2014 International Convention

#### ad hoc DKG Election Process Committee

Members voting at the 2014 International Convention will consider proposed amendments that determine whether to continue with our current process of delegate voting or to institute a general election that allows every member to vote in the election of Administrative Board and elected committee members.

All members in attendance at the convention vote on proposed amendments to the *Constitution* and the *International Standing Rules*. Officers and elected committee members are currently elected by state organization presidents who have one vote for every five active and reserve members. The state organization president may cast all her states' votes for a particular nominee or she may split her vote if there is more than one nominee.

If the convention votes to allow every member to vote, all members will be able to vote for the members of the Administrative Board. All members would vote for president, the vice presidents, the member-at-large, and Finance Committee members while only members within a region will vote for their regional director and regional representatives to the Nominations Committee. Only Latin American and Canadian members would vote for their own area representative. Members would vote electronically or by requested paper ballot.

The Ad Hoc Elections Process Committee (EPC), approved by the 2012 Executive Board and appointed by President Dr. Beverly Helms, has researched costs, consulted the Finance Committee, studied the nominations process, communicated with members, and solicited member input via Survey Monkey and at regional conferences.

Various vending companies have submitted estimated costs of an electronic election ranging between \$15,000 and \$25,000 per election. The 2012-2014 Finance Committee is aware of the possibility of an every member voting election process. If the change is approved, the 2014-2016 Finance Committee will have the task of budgeting for the new voting process.

The ad hoc committee submitted to the Constitution Committee proposed amendments that would make a general election possible. The convention has the final authority whether to approve or disapprove proposed amendments. The decision rests with the vote of the 2014 convention.

#### **Anne Matthews State Scholarship**

Last year, I had the honor of receiving the Anne Matthews state scholarship from the Alpha Beta State Organization of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International. My quest for this scholarship began as I learned about the availability of four state scholarships at the Alpha Alpha Chapter meeting.

I had been accepted into the inaugural cohort of the doctoral program at Frostburg State University which requires students to be enrolled in courses year round. I knew that receiving this scholarship would ease my financial burden. However, with the first year of the program being 21 hours of coursework, I found my major concern was being able to complete the application requirements in time to have an opportunity to be considered for a scholarship.

Upon receiving the scholarship information, I found that the application process was not as demanding as I envisioned. I completed my application, wrote a letter of intent, asked my principal for a letter of recommendation, as well as my chapter president, Ann Frantz. Coming from rural Garrett County, I was concerned about competition from urban and suburban areas across the state. I felt pride representing my chapter at the state convention as the scholarship recipient.

I am now entering my second year of the doctoral program. As I look back at the highs in this past year, one of them was being named a recipient of the Anne Matthews scholarship. Alpha Beta State Organization offers four of these scholarships which provide members with a wonderful opportunity to advance their education and pursue their educational goals. I would encourage any DKG member who is doing graduate work to consider applying for these scholarships. The time investment is worth the reward.
